SCHOLARSHIP PURPOSE

Students are a valuable part of the community who should be taught to value public participation in their communities and neighborhoods and to value volunteer service. NASWC supports this goal and has committed to provide two scholarships to neighborhood students to promote good community leadership in the future by rewarding promising young community leaders today; and, to nurture participation in the volunteer work that improves our community.

QUALIFICATIONS AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Two scholarships will be awarded high school seniors who are graduating from a public, private, or home school during the academic year; or students currently enrolled in a college, university or accredited technical school
- 2) The student must have a C average or better. Include a current, sealed transcript from the student's school with this application.
- 3) Applicants must be current residents within the NASWC boundaries. Those boundaries are Anderson Mill Road to the South, Hwy 620 to the North, Parmer Lane to the East, and Hwy 183 to the West. Should a question arise concerning the validity of the applicant's home address, a Texas Driver's License or voter registration card with the graduate's current home address will be required.
- 4) Applicants must be living in a NASWC-member household whose membership is in good standing; dues paid in full before submission of the application.
- 5) Two letters of recommendation are required to be submitted with this application. These can be from community leaders such as an educator, religious leader, elected official, service organization leader, or adult Scout leader.
- 6) NASWC will distribute the Scholarship money upon receipt of proof of registration at a college or technical school for at least one semester in the coming academic year.
