

Forest North Drainage Improvement Project Construction Update – February 2021



Dear Neighbor,

You are receiving this email because you signed up for regular updates about the Forest North Drainage Improvement Project or have reached out with questions since the project began.

The purpose of the Forest North Drainage Improvement Project is to upgrade the drainage infrastructure throughout the neighborhood. The project is in its third and final phase, which includes seven zones. These specific zones cluster around frequently reoccurring structural flooding in the area. DeNucci Constructors, LLC, the general contractor, began construction in June 2020 and work is underway in each zone.

As part of this project, new City of Austin (COA) water lines are being installed throughout each zone. This work is currently underway in the Newberry and Woodvale zones; it will begin soon in the Shasta zone, which is the final zone scheduled for this work. The nature of this work involves temporary water shut-offs coordinated with COA, in order to make a connection to the main water line and supply system. Residents should receive notice from COA before any water shut-offs occur. Storm sewer installation has been completed in Braes Valley, Norchester and Sherbourne zones, and continues in Shady Oaks. As work begins to wrap up in each zone, DeNucci will begin concrete work and repairs to pavement and landscaping. This work is underway in the Braes Valley, Norchester and Sherbourne zones.

Phase III Residents:

Staking of the right-of-way (ROW) and easements has taken place in each zone, using pink flags to indicate the ROW and easement limits for the areas that are designated for construction improvements. Before construction begins near your property, a member of the construction team will make an in-person visit to answer questions. The ROW and easements must be clear for work by the start of construction in your zone. If you wish to preserve items in the ROW or easement, such as landscaping or custom mailboxes, removal must occur prior to the start of construction. If the identified items are not removed by the time construction begins in your area, the contractor will consider these items left for refuse.

Mailboxes: Mailboxes in the path of drainage work will be removed and replaced with standard units. We are in close communication with the post office to ensure there is no disruption of mail service.

Driveways: The regrading of channels and replacement of driveway culverts will require the reconstruction of some driveways. Driveways will be accessible by the end of each workday. Driveway repairs will be made upon completion of the entirety of the work at each property. Notice will be provided to homeowners and residents at least 48 hours prior to any driveway access interruptions.

Irrigation Systems: Irrigation systems in the path of drainage work will be removed, capped at the ROW line and will not be replaced.

Landscaping and Trees: Landscaping located in the ROW or easements must be moved prior to the start of construction. Tree removal occurs on a case-by-case basis. DeNucci does everything possible to save trees in the ROW. Trees are only removed if construction is going to directly impact them or if it is so close that it would damage the roots and therefore need to be removed at a later date.

Please, note that one-way traffic control may occur daily at various locations. Any vehicles parked on the street may need to be relocated while work occurs.
